

Great politician? dies aged 56 TRIBUTES: The death

TRIBUTES have been paid to former Musselburgh councillor John Ross, whose death has shocked the community he represented for more than 17 years.

A Labour stalwart, Mr Ross (56) was admitted earlier this month to Edinburgh's Western General, with a great political brain." where he died on Saturday.

With the reorganisation of local government in 1996, and the creation of Scotland's unitary authorities, Mr Ross won the Musselburgh South seat in the first elections to the new East Lothian Council.

As part of the council's ruling Labour group, he held a number of senior posts, chairing the environment committee and then the education committee.

A resident of Market Street, Musselburgh, Mr Ross was long-standing member of the local Labour Party branch.

He was devastated in 2007 when he failed to secure re-election to the council, following the introduction of proportional representation through the Single Transferable Vote. This allowed him to devote his
